



Trick or Treat Guidelines 2020

The Historic Downtown Long Grove Business Association (HDLGBA) has historically provided trick-or-treating hours for Halloween. Halloween 2020 comes with extra precautions. The HDLGBA has established trick-or-treat hours from 2-5 p.m. on Friday, October 23 in downtown Long Grove with the understanding that parents should utilize their own discretion to determine if trick-or-treating is an “at-risk” activity for them. To assist, the HDLGBA has developed guidance for participation in the tradition. The CDC considers traditional trick-or-treating a high-risk activity this year.

We urge walkers to keep these guidelines in mind:

- Do not participate in trick-or-treat if you or a member of your household is not feeling well; if you have recently returned from a hotspot state; if you are waiting for COVID-19 test results or know that you have been exposed to COVID-19.
- Long Grove merchants will have a “Welcome Trick-or-Treaters” sign indicating they are participating. If they do not have a sign, please do not enter unless you are shopping.
- Face coverings should be worn by all participants over the age of two, including individuals passing out treats.
- Trick-or-Treat as a household, avoiding groups of others.
- Frequently use hand sanitizer and sanitize after coming into contact with high touch points such as door knobs.
- Maintain at least 6 ft distance between groups.
